The Loudoun County Board of Supervisors allocated local American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to support nonprofits in diversifying funding sources. This resource is made possible through the use of federal funds. The purpose of this Data Toolkit is to assist users in identifying publicly available data that are relevant to nonprofits and other organizations that serve Loudoun County residents. Loudoun County encourages grant applicants to use data in their storytelling, which creates a more compelling value proposition for their organization. The Data Toolkit shares resources that will assist organizations in describing their community and identifying needs with a focus on grant writing and management. This toolkit does not contain an exhaustive list of resources; however, Loudoun County staff will periodically update the Data Toolkit, which is posted on the county's website. As a part of Loudoun County's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds efforts, the Department of Finance and Procurement offers capacity building professional development trainings to nonprofits to assist in diversifying funding leveraging more resources in the Loudoun County community. These trainings are designed to highlight resources, best practices from peer organizations, and provide hands on technical assistance to participants. Two professional development series were held in the fall 2022 and spring 2023 over the course of six-eight weeks with the purpose of expanding capacity of nonprofits for grant and data management. The National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) is the primary statistical agency of the U.S. Department of Education. It is one of thirteen principal federal statistical agencies whose activities are predominantly focused on the collection, compilation, processing, or analysis of information for statistical purposes. NCES is located within the U.S. Department of Education's Institute of Education Sciences (IES). NCES has a Congressional mandate to collect, collate, analyze, and report complete statistics on the condition of American education; conduct and publish reports; and review and report on education activities internationally.

The BLM, with its extensive and complex land-management mission across 245 million surface and 700 million sub-surface acres, regularly gathers, maintains, and publishes various types of data to inform stakeholders and the general public about its stewardship responsibilities.

These estimates provide the best approximation of the population count on July 1st of the prior year. Population estimates are an important tool used by a variety of state agencies in their planning processes — from developing budgets to determining salaries for public officials.

[Board of Supervisors \(BOS\) Resolution: Social and Racial Equity as Fundamental Value](#)

At its January 17, 2023, meeting, the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors voted to approve a resolution identifying social and racial equity as fundamental values for Loudoun County government. The resolution in part, calls for the county to promote fairness and justice as it develops and implements its priorities, policies and programs. The resolution also calls for a collaborative effort among community partners to intentionally promote equity.

In a region known for its affluence, the Center documented a 17-year gap in life expectancy across census tracts and identified 15 “islands of disadvantage,” neighborhoods where residents, disproportionately people of color, face harsh living conditions.
